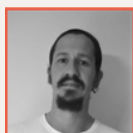

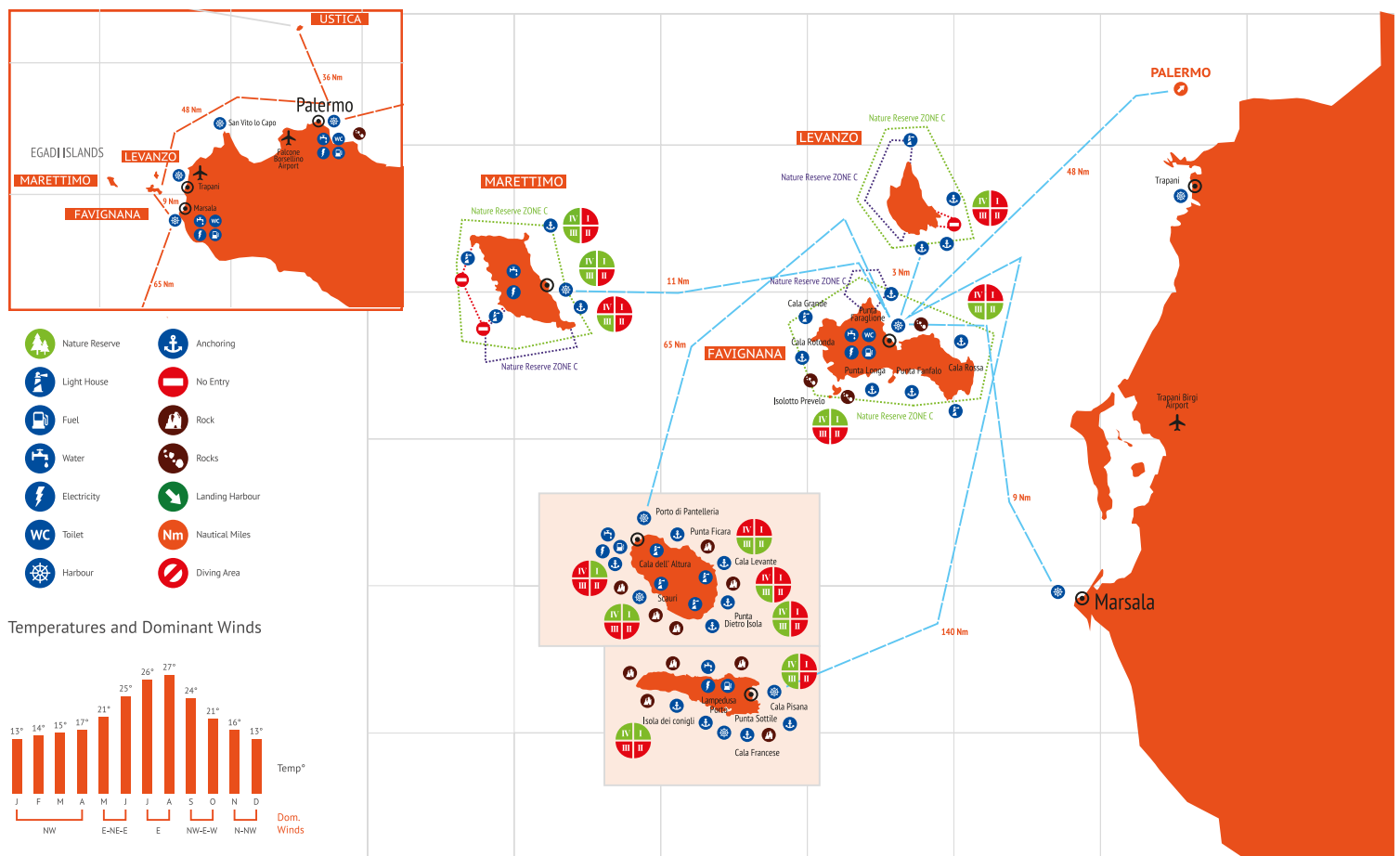

Discover the Egadi Islands

Our base in Palermo is located 48 nautical miles away from the Egadi Islands. To fully enjoy this journey, we recommend a refreshing stop in the breathtaking San Vito Lo Capo (36.5 NM from our marina in Palermo), famous for its Caribbean-like beaches and turquoise and coral shaded sea. Heading towards Scopello, extends the 7km long Zingaro Nature Reserve, an unspoiled area where nature reigns supreme and is characterized by dwarf palm trees in which protected birds and birds of prey nest. San Vito Lo Capo is also known for the Cous Cous Fest, the festival of flavors and civilizations which every year celebrates couscous as a meal of peace and integration.

For diving enthusiasts:

The Island of Ustica is located 36 nautical miles away from our base in Palermo, a true natural paradise for diving and snorkeling lovers. The island is in fact the first Marine Park established in the Mediterranean, a Protected Marine Area since 1986: its coasts are brimming with secret caves, coves, colorful fish, and its most beautiful beaches are Cala Sidoti, Caletta Santoro, Spiaggia del Faro and the Natural Swimming Pool of Ustica.



The Egadi Islands archipelago, composed of the islands of Favignana, Levanzo, and Marettimo (as well as the rocks of Maraone and Formica), is located just 5 miles from Trapani and boasts the largest protected marine area in Europe.

The sea of the Egadi Islands, due to its particular hydrodynamic conditions, is among the cleanest and clearest in the Mediterranean. Its seabed is characterized by meadows of oceanic posidonia that extend to very deep depths (30/40 meters) and constitute a precious ecosystem, ideal for the reproduction of numerous fish species. The characteristics of the archipelago make it a highly sought-after destination for all sea lovers, diving enthusiasts, and sailors. The prevailing wind is the Grecale, which, blowing from the northeast, allows us to say that in the Egadi islands, you can always sail upwind!



FAVIGNANA

It is the largest island of the Aegadian Islands and also the most populated. The island has a characteristic butterfly shape and its name comes from "Favonius", the Roman god of hot and dry winds. Located about 9 miles from Trapani, the island has beautiful beaches (Cala Rossa being the most famous) and stunning untouched coves. Not to be missed are the sea caves, reachable by boat, such as the Grotta dei Sospiri. Favignana boasts the only active tuna fishery in the Mediterranean for commercial purposes, and also houses the historic Florio establishment which is now a beautiful archaeological museum, where the equipment used for tuna fishing is kept, along with workshops, boat sheds and ovens for cooking the tuna.



LEVANZO

The Genovese Cave, with its prehistoric graffiti, is one of the most popular attractions on the island of Levanzo. The coast is very jagged and offers secluded coves and beaches, sometimes difficult to reach. Unlike Favignana, there are no sandy beaches and the best way to explore them all is by boat.



MARETTIMO

It is an uncontaminated island, the wildest and most distant from the Sicilian coast. Here you will not find equipped beaches with beach resorts, umbrellas and bars (unlike Favignana). In fact, Marettimo is a completely different island from the others: mountainous, very green and, in addition to being the realm of scuba divers, it is a paradise for trekking enthusiasts.
