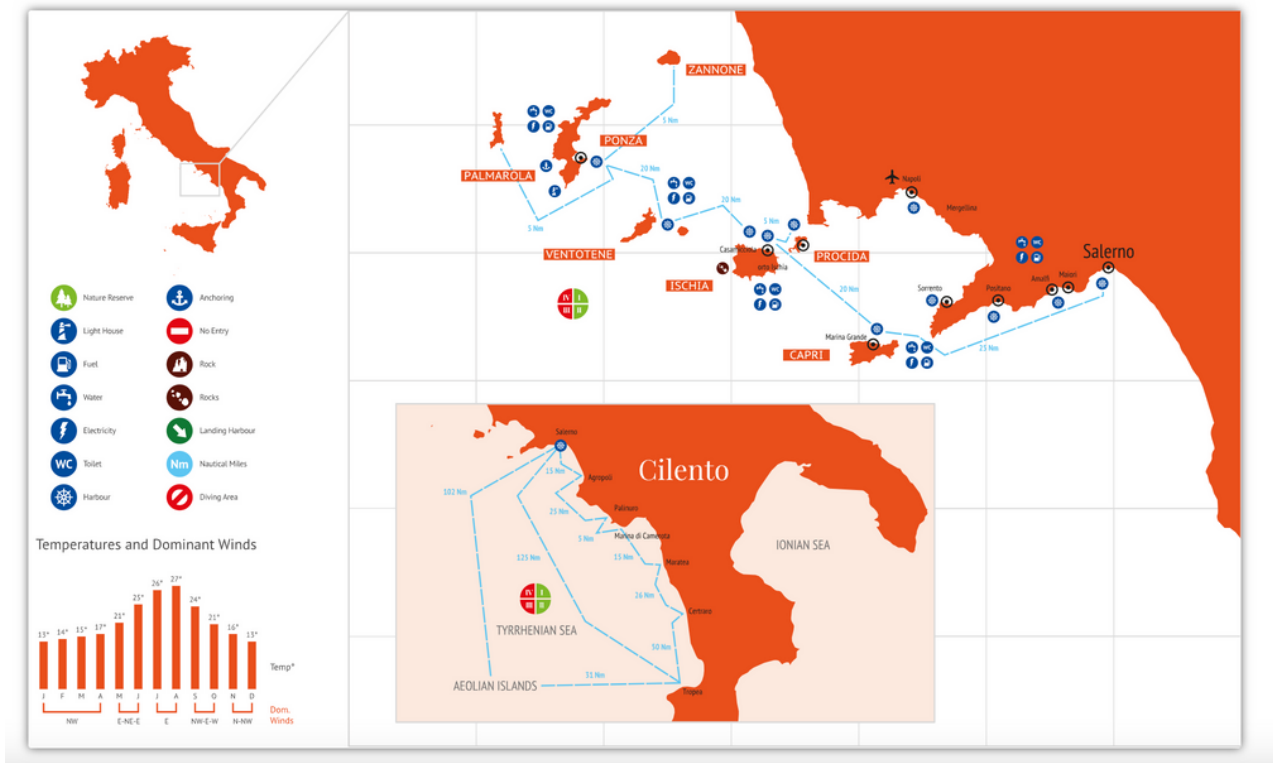

DISCOVER THE AMALFI COAST



Positioned in that 50 kilometer stretch of coast that takes its name from Amalfi (a true jewel set in the rock), our base in Salerno is the ideal point from which to set sail for a holiday of sea, culture and food and wine tradition along the Amalfi coast and the Sorrento peninsula.

The Amalfi coast and the Sorrento peninsula have been fully included in the list of "World Heritage" sites since 1997; locations such as Amalfi, Sorrento and Positano, favored by their strategic and favorable positions, have been tourist destinations since the times of the ancient Romans and a point of reference for the cultural and naturalistic value of these places.

Added to these "land" locations are the neighboring islands (Pontine Islands, Flegrean Islands and Capri), whose uniqueness is due not only to the infrastructures and services present in the nautical bases but, also and above all, to the variety of exclusive places, set like precious stones inside rocks from the Mediterranean coast.

THE PONTINE ISLANDS



Ponza

It is considered by many to be the most beautiful island in the Mediterranean probably due to the large number of bays and coves, all enchanting and with easy and safe anchoring thanks to the presence of sandy seabeds. The most beautiful beaches are those accessible only from the sea, such as Chiaia di Luna (the most famous), which takes its name from the brightness of the cliff by which it is protected or, Cala del Core, where the magma has formed a heart on the rock.



Ventotene

It is the Pontine island closest to Naples, halfway between Ischia and Ponza: entirely pedestrianized and of simple and disarming beauty, it is the ideal destination for a relaxing holiday. With its rocky seabed it is much appreciated by divers, Ventotene is a true paradise for lovers of the sea, diving and excursions. Just half a mile from Ventotene there is the islet of Santo Stefano, where the remains of the imposing Bourbon prison are preserved, active until 1965, which made the island completely off-limits.

Today Santo Stefano, together with Ventotene, constitutes the heart of the protected marine area which determines its accessibility based on the provisions envisaged.

DISCOVER THE CILENTO COAST



From Salerno towards the Cilento Coast!

A few miles from our base in Salerno, in a southerly direction, the Cilento coast opens up and extends to the Gulf of Policastro. This stretch of coast, together with its seaside resorts which have obtained recognition from Legambiente and the Foundation for Environmental Education, have been declared a World Heritage Site by UNESCO.

The Cilento coast is both crystal clear sea and pristine beaches, as well as enchanting villages, rich in history, legends and food and wine traditions.

A sailing holiday along the Cilento coast allows you to dive into a sea of Mediterranean beauty.

Absolutely worth visiting are Paestum, Agropoli, Santa Maria di Castellabate, Punta Licosa, Accliaroli, Palinuro and Ascea.



Paestum

It is known throughout the world for its magnificent Greek temples which, alongside the sanctuaries and Roman remains on the island, make it one of the most famous archaeological sites in the world. A visit to Paestum literally means taking a real dive into the centuries past.



Agropoli

It is the so-called "Gateway to the Cilento Coast"; the first tourist port we find on the map south of Salerno. Agropoli is a real point of reference for all passing boaters. Don't miss the Bay of Trentova with its blue-white rock which, according to legend, was populated by Ulysses' sirens.





Punta Licosa

Continuing south we find Punta Licosa, famous for the seabed of the coves from which it is possible to admire the remains of a submerged Roman villa.



Acciaroli

A fishing village that has still remained authentic despite the tourist boom that has overwhelmed it. It is rumored that its alleys and shops inspired "The Old Man and the Sea" by Ernest Hemingway, a great lover of these places. In Acciaroli there is the renowned Pollica beach, the most awarded in Italy for cleanliness and beauty.



Palinuro

The town takes its name directly from Greek mythology: "Palinuro", Aeneas' helmsman. Here myth and reality mix. The promontory of Capo Palinuro, overlooking the sea, offers an unforgettable panorama, while the coast is dotted with caves from which a fairy-tale light filters due to various optical effects. Among the beaches, the Blue Grotto is certainly the most famous, but we also recommend visiting that of the Natural Arch, one of the symbols of the village, and the golden one of the Baia del Buon Dormire, one of the most photographed of all.





Marina di Camerota

A lovely town immersed in the Cilento and Vallo di Diano National Park. Its Cala Bianca, which is so called because of the white beach surrounded by Mediterranean scrub, can only be reached by boat. If, however, you want an intimate and private place, away from the crowd, the Pozzallo beach is ideal, surrounded by beautiful coves. The emerald green sea of Monte di Luna, Cala degli Infreschi and Cala d'Arconte is no exception. Marina di Ascea, separated from the countryside by a forest of centuries-old olive trees, is a municipality located near the cliffs of Punta del Telegrafo where there are coves to explore and enjoy in solitude.
