

From Porto Rotondo – Punta Asfodeli it is possible to set sail for Southern Corsica.


some of the most extraordinary places to visit in the southern part of this fascinating island.

Bonifacio: is a city nestled on limestone cliffs with a panoramic view of the sea. Its picturesque streets, old walls and citadel tell stories that are thousands of years old. Do not forget to visit the Grotte di Bonifacio, a complex of sea caves that reveal the hidden beauty of the Corsican coast.

Porto-Vecchio: famous for its white sandy beaches and crystal clear waters.

Plage de Palombaggia and Santa Giulia are earthly paradises where you can relax under the radiant sun and swim in a turquoise sea. The streets of the old town of Porto-Vecchio, with its charming cafés and shops, are also worth a quiet stroll.

Sartène: Known as the "most Corsican city in Corsica". Its narrow cobbled streets, granite houses and vibrant street life capture the essence of the island. Don't miss the traditional Sartène Fair in September, a unique experience to immerse yourself in local traditions. Bavella: Nature lovers can't miss the enchanting mountainous region of Bavella. The Aiguilles de Bavella, granite peaks that touch the sky, offer spectacular hikes and breathtaking panoramic views. The Ospedale forest, with its crystal-clear lakes, is a haven of serenity surrounded by greenery.



Archipelago of La Maddalena

From Marina di Cannigione it is possible to reach in a few hours of navigation the National Park and Marine Reserve of the archipelago of La Maddalena, famous for their beauty and uncontaminated nature and, renowned throughout the world, for the beaches, the clarity and transparency of their waters, which recall those of the Caribbean.

Here are some must-see places to visit during your sailing adventure.

Spiaggia Rosa di Budelli: accessible only by sea, this beach owes its name to the characteristic color of the sand, a pale pink due to the grains of coral. An enchanting place to stop, swim in the transparent waters and admire the unique landscape.

Spargi Archipelago: Sailing towards the island of Spargi, stop at the bay of Cala Corsara. This isolated corner is surrounded by imposing cliffs and offers a quiet anchorage. Snorkeling and diving are a must here, thanks to the rich marine life that populates its seabed.

Caprera Island: Explore the famous Cala Coticcio, also known as "Tahiti".

This hidden bay is surrounded by granite rocks and offers turquoise waters ideal for swimming. A magical place where you can enjoy a quiet day on a boat and relax on the white sand beach.

La Maddalena: the historic center of the city offers a pleasant walk through cobbled streets, shops and restaurants. From the port, you can organize excursions to discover the other treasures of the archipelago.
