The Egadi Islands are very popular with sailors (and not only) because they allow, regardless of the wind, to stay sheltered, that is, protected.

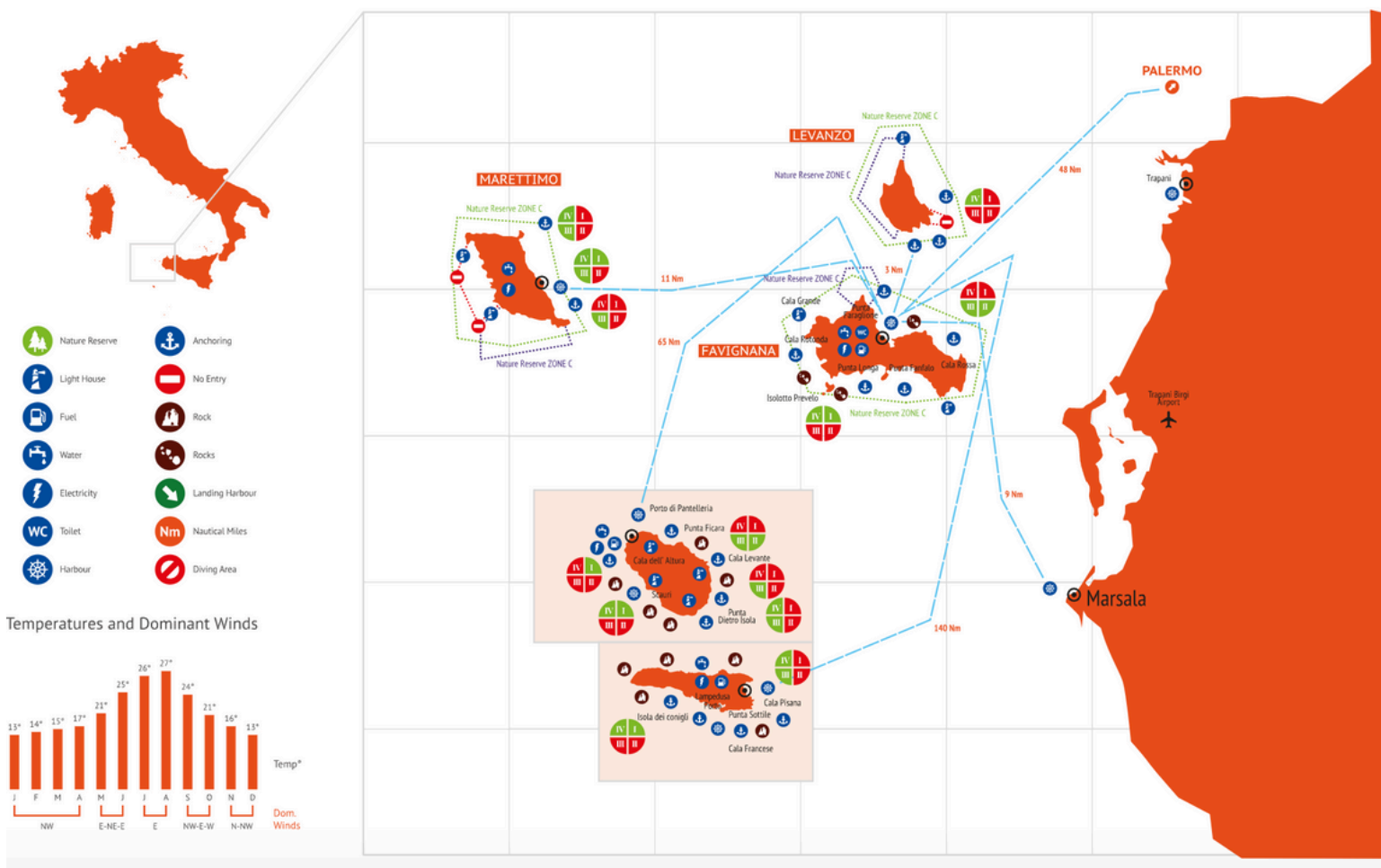
Furthermore, the proximity between the islands (3 miles from Levanzo to Favignana) allows you to quickly reach numerous and beautiful coves where you can drop anchor without the risk of running aground.

The archipelago of the Egadi islands, composed of the islands of Favignana, Levanzo and Marettimo (in addition to the rocks of Maraone and Formica) is located just 5 miles from Trapani and boasts the largest Marine Protected Area in Europe.

The sea of the Egadi, due to its particular hydrodynamic conditions, is among the cleanest and clearest in the Mediterranean; its seabed is characterized by meadows of oceanic posidonia that extend even to very high depths (30/40 meters), and which constitute a precious ecosystem ideal for the reproduction of numerous fish species.

The characteristics of the archipelago make this a very popular destination for all sea lovers and diving and sailing enthusiasts.

The predominant wind is the north-east, which blows from the north/east, making us say that: "in the Egadi you always tack!".

Favignana island

It is the largest island of the Egadi islands, and also the most inhabited. The island has a characteristic butterfly shape and its name derives from "Favonius", the Roman god of hot and dry winds. Located about 9 miles from Trapani, Favignana has beautiful beaches (Cala Rossa is the most famous) and stunning uncontaminated coves. Not to be missed are the sea caves that can be reached by boat, such as the Grotta dei Sospiri.

Favignana boasts the only active Tonnara in the Mediterranean for commercial purposes, as well as hosting the historic Florio factory, which has now become a beautiful archaeological museum that houses the equipment used for tuna fishing, the ancient workshops, the boathouses and the ovens for cooking tuna.



Levanzo island

The Genovese cave with its prehistoric graffiti is certainly one of the most popular attractions on the island of Levanzo. The coast is very jagged and offers coves and solitary beaches that are sometimes difficult to reach. Here, unlike Favignana, there are no sandy beaches and the best way to explore them all is by boat.



Marettimo islands

It is an uncontaminated island, the wildest and the most distant from the Sicilian coast: there are no beaches equipped with lidos, umbrellas and bars, as in Favignana. Marettimo is a mountainous island, very green and, in addition to being the kingdom of divers, it is a paradise for trekking enthusiasts.
